## Composition of the Academic Assessment Committee

- Two (1 liaison and 1 alternate) Department Liaisons (Committee members) from each department are named by their department chair; or selected by the department.
- Liaisons are confirmed annually by Department Chairs; the term of the Liaison is not limited, though the committee encourages regular rotation of these positions.
- In any voting matter, no more than 2 votes may be cast from any department, even if more representatives are present.
- There are 2 Faculty Co-Chairs elected by the committee; co-chairs serve two-year terms on a staggered basis, such that only one new co-chair is elected annually at the end of the Spring semester and their term begins the following Fall.
- The Director of Assessment and Assessment Specialist serve in an ex-officio capacity on the Committee to provide support.


## Charge to the Academic Assessment Committee

- Discuss and review the assessment of student learning in courses and academic programs, facilitate college-wide discussions, and provide procedural and process recommendations to improve BMCC's institution-wide assessment system.
- Reports program level recommendations to the curriculum committee of the Academic Senate. Report institutional/structural recommendations to the Provost.
- Monitor the implementation of the academic assessment portion of the BMCC Institutional Effectiveness Plan, as appropriate.
- Serve as a resource to academic departments in the development, implementation, and assessment of departmental, program, and course assessments.
- Plan and oversee the annual BMCC Academic Assessment Day.
- Participate in the planning of assessment workshops and the development of assessment resources at the college.


## Role of the Academic Assessment Committee Members

- Attend the monthly meetings of the Academic assessment committee.
- Act as the assessment liaison to their academic department, share the discussions, assessment strategies, and recommendations from the Committee during Department meetings and assessment committee meetings (or via email as necessary).
- Engage in professional development to further hone their assessment knowledge and skills.
- Operate as an assessment resource within their departments and for the College.
- Attend and participate in Assessment Day.
- Submit departmental assessment materials to the Academic Assessment committee when required.
- Be a member of at least one subcommittee of the Academic Assessment Committee.
