- 3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.:

  This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website and the Southern New Hampshire University website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
