



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FORM

A. SENDING AND RECEIVING INSTITUTIONS:

Sending College: Borough of Manhattan Community College (CUNY)
 Department: Social Sciences, Human Services and Criminal Justice and Speech,
 Communications and Theatre Arts
 Program: Gender and Women’s Studies (Interdisciplinary program)
 Degree: Associate in Arts (A.A.)

Receiving College: Hunter College (CUNY)
 Department: Women and Gender Studies
 Program: Women and Gender Studies
 Degree: Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)

B. PURPOSE:

Borough of Manhattan Community College-CUNY (hereafter referred to as BMCC) and Hunter College-CUNY (hereafter referred to as Hunter) agree to articulate the option outlined in this document to ensure a smooth transfer process for Borough of Manhattan Community College graduates.

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement (the “Agreement”) is to establish collaboration between Borough of Manhattan Community College and Hunter College, to promote degree completion and facilitate the transfer process.

C. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM:

Applicants successfully completing an associate’s degree in Gender and Women’s Studies at BMCC will be guaranteed transfer admission in the bachelor’s degree program in Women and Gender Studies at Hunter and will transfer with junior standing based on the following conditions:

- A GPA equal to or higher than the current GPA required for general transfer students to Hunter College;
- Successful completion of a 3-credit college-level English Course;
- Grade of C or better in all Liberal Arts/Women, Gender and Sexuality Studies course(s);
- Successful completion of a 3- credit college-level mathematics course.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 60

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 60

Total credits required to complete the baccalaureate degree: 120

D. TRANSFER CREDITS AWARDED:

Borough of Manhattan Community College graduates who complete the Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree in Gender and Women's Studies will receive up to 70 credits toward the Bachelor of Arts (B.A) degree in Women and Gender Studies at Hunter College.

E. COURSE EQUIVALENCIES:

BMCC credits that do not count for requirements in the Hunter WGS major can count as elective credit toward the degree or credit toward a minor or another major (based on degree requirements in other programs at Hunter).

1. COM 265 has a pre-requisite of SPE 100.
2. A total of 9 credits is required. Choose 3 courses from AFN 128, AFN 129, ANT 210, COM 245, COM 255, ECO 230, ENG 346, ENG 353, HED 225, HIS 225, POL 120, PSY 245, SPN 400 or THE 305.
3. SOC 210 has a pre-requisite of SOC 100.
4. GWS 100 and 2 GWS electives must be passed before taking GWS 300.
5. AST 109 & AST 108, CHE 109 & CHE 108, or PHY 109 & PHY 108 are alternate course options.
6. A total of 9 credits is required. Some credits may be satisfied by taking STEM variants in the common core. NOTE: A maximum of 6 elective credits may be taken in career departments.
7. Select any Creative Expression Pathways course except SPE 100 or SPE 102.

I. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES:

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

The agreement becomes effective on the date of signature by representatives of BMCC and Hunter. The agreement may be renewed, modified, or terminated by mutual consent by representatives from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program directors.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Each semester Hunter College will provide BMCC the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website, and on Hunter College's website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students. In the event it is decided at any time to modify or terminate this agreement, commitments made to individual students already in the program, will continue in effect for the terms applicable at the time the student enrolled in the program.
