**Re:** Nursing Admission “Credit/No Credit” Grading Memo (Effective Fall 2020)

---

The Nursing Program is following the COVID Pandemic admission process for Spring 2021 admission. It is important to understand that BMCC has selected an option to best meet the needs of the college community.

By following the Fall 2020 policy, BMCC students can opt-in to a CR grade if their earned grade is B+ through D-, NC grade if earned grade is F as long as the course is not in the Course Exclusions List in which case the student will not be able to opt-in to CR/NC grades.

Before choosing this CR/NC grading option for one or more of their classes, students should consult with their academic, faculty and financial aid advisors regarding potential impact to their financial aid, major requirements, transferability, licensure requirements, and undergraduate/graduate school admissions.

Here are some of the details of the [Fall 2020 Flexible Grading Policy-Credit/No Credit \(CR/NC\)](#) adopted by BMCC:

- During the Fall 2020 semester, students shall have the option to convert any or all of their B+ through F grades they earn in their classes, to Credit/No Credit grading except NUR, EMC, HIT and RTT-designated courses.
- Students shall be able to make this decision up to 24 calendar days (**from December 23, 2020 through January 15, 2021**) after the College’s final grade submission deadline. Once selected, the CR/NC option cannot be reversed.

The Nursing Program is advising **ALL potential candidates** to follow the guideline to their benefit:

Students who opt-in for CR/NC grade in any of the 5 prerequisite courses (ENG 101, MAT 104, PSY 100, CHE 121, and BIO 425) and receive a CR/NC grade during Fall 2020 will NOT be eligible to apply into the nursing program. To be eligible to apply into the nursing program, students will have to repeat the CR/NC course in a subsequent term and receive a letter grade to be calculated into the prerequisite course index (PCI).
