*I will respect at all times the dignity and religious beliefs  
of the patients under my care, holding in confidence all personal  
information entrusted to me. And refraining from any action,  
which might endanger life or health.*

*I will endeavor to keep my professional knowledge and  
skills at the highest level and to give loyal support and coopera-  
tion to all members of the health team.*

*I will do my utmost to honor the international code of ethics  
applied to nursing and to uphold the integrity of the Registered  
Professional Nurse.*

The International Council of Nurses, founded in 1899, was the first international organization for health care professionals. It is presently headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland, home of the World Health Organization. This pledge affirms the common goals of nurses around the world.
