F. ADVISOR RECOMMENDATIONS

Students are strongly advised to take MAT 209 and MAT 301 at BMCC in the Program Electives area. These two courses in particular and needed to complete the B.A. in Economics at City College. Students who do not take these courses at BMCC, will have to take the equivalent courses at City College, which may result in them taking more than 60 credits at City College.

G. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons and/or program directors.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Each semester City College (the receiving college) will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website, and City College's website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
