



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FORM

A. SENDING AND RECEIVING INSTITUTIONS

Sending College: Borough of Manhattan Community College

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This agreement applies to Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) students that have successfully met graduation requirements prior to their enrollment at The College of New Rochelle (CNR) and will apply to BMCC students that enroll at The College of New Rochelle beginning fall 2016.

### B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

BMCC Human Services graduates with at least a 2.5 cumulative GPA will be admitted to the CNR Social Work program upon successful completion of the Social Work program application. These students will be granted junior status.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: **60**

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: **61**

Total credits required to complete the baccalaureate degree: **121**

### C. TRANSFER CREDIT AWARDED

BMCC graduates who complete the Associate of Science (A.S.) degree in Human Services will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelors of Science in Social Work (B.S.) at CNR.

**D. COURSES TO BE COMPLETED AT THE SENIOR COLLEGE FOR THE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE**

Students will graduate with a B.S. in Social Work once they have completed 121 total credits. Therefore, combined with the 60 transfer credits, students will take 61 credits at CNR. Students are also required to take 4 zero-credit Health & Wellness courses in order to earn their degree.

Graduates of the BMCC Human Services program will be waived from the CNR core liberal arts requirements.

## **E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES**

### **1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:**

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their Chairpersons. In the event that no curricular changes are made, the agreement will be renewed every 5 years.

### **2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:**

Each semester CNR will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

### **3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisors, Websites, etc.:**

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website, and the CNR website. Printed and electronic materials will also be used as marketing tools. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

## **F. Additional Information (e.g., financial aid, transfer scholarships)**

### **Scholarships**

CNR, in partnership with BMCC, will create and award The College of New Rochelle/Borough of Manhattan Community College Transfer Scholarship, in an effort to encourage BMCC students to earn their associate degree credentials, facilitate transfer to the four-year institution, and support completion of the bachelor's degree at CNR. This scholarship will also serve as marketing/recruitment tools for the receiving institution. Each award will be in the amount of \$10,000 per year for two years, assuming the following criteria are met:

The College of New Rochelle/Borough of Manhattan Community College Transfer Scholarship will have the following criteria:

- Students must earn a minimum GPA of 2.5
- Students **MUST** graduate with an associate's degree from BMCC
- Students must register at CNR as full-time and matriculated in the School of Arts and Sciences

The scholarship will be renewable annually, as long students meet the following minimum requirements:

- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5
- Maintain full-time matriculated status (at least 12 credits per fall/spring semester)
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress towards a degree at CNR

CNR offers other merit and need based scholarships to transfer students. Students will be notified of these additional awards at the time of admissions or once they've submitted a FAFSA form to CNR.
