B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

Students with an A.A. or An A.S. degree must have a minimum of a 3.0 cumulative grade point average for acceptance to Binghamton University. Student below the 3.0 minimum GPA may be considered for conditional Acceptance when:

- All relevant transfer admissions criteria are met;
- Space is available in the entering class; and
- A completed application is received by March 15 for fall admission and November 15 for spring admission.

Harpur College requires at least 44 credits taken in residence at Binghamton University and a total of at least 126 credits (including transfer credit) to graduate. Courses must have a grade of C- or better to be accepted as transfer credit into Harpur College. Courses for some majors may require a higher grade to be accepted as credit toward the major.

C. TRANSFER CREDIT AWARDED

Borough of Manhattan Community College graduates who complete the Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree in Liberal Arts will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of Arts (B.A) degree in Philosophy, Politics & Law (PPL) at Harpur College of Arts and Sciences, Binghamton University (SUNY). To be prepared to pursue the B.A. in Philosophy, Politics, and Law at Harpur College students must take the courses indicated in the footnotes below.

- 1. Students are advised to take MAT 150.
- 2. Students are advised to take AST 108/109, BIO 108/109, CHE 108/109, or PHY 108/109. These are lecture/lab corequisite courses that Satisfy the lab science requirement.
- 3. Students are advised to take ART 251, MUS 102, MUS 103, or THE 100 to satisfy GEN Ed requirements at Harpur College.
- 4. Modern Language Course (Spanish, French, Italian, Chinese or Arabic).
- 5. Students are advised to take SOC 125, AFN 123 or AFN 124.
- 6. Students are advised to take SOC 100 or ANT 115/LIN 100 to satisfy GEN ED requirements.

- 7. HED 201through 225 and 235, 250 and 260 will satisfy the Wellness General Education requirement.
- 8. Students are advised to take GEO 100, HIS 115 or 116, or ANT/LAT 200.
- 9. Students are advised to take HIS 120 and HIS 125 and either POL 100 or 210 to fulfill (3) of the PPL major requirements. One course should be selected from the following to fulfill one Cognate course requirement: ECO 201, ECO 202, PHI 110, PHI 115, PHI 120 or SOC 200.

F. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their Chairpersons.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Each semester Harpur College will provide the Borough of Manhattan Community College the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) and the number of BMCC students who enrolled; d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicizing on the Borough of Manhattan Community College's website, and the Binghamton University website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
