<b>Liberal Arts Electives:</b> Liberal Arts electives are courses in Art, English, Ethnic Studies, Health Education, Mathematics, Modern Languages, Music, Speech, Science and Social Science. ITL 170 is a Liberal Arts elective. A maximum of 6 credits that are taken in career departments may count as electives in the Liberal Arts program (e.g. ACC, ADV, BUS, CCC, CED, CIS, CSC, ECE, EDB, EDU, EMC, FNB, HIT, HUM, MAR, MMP, NUR, OFF, RET, RLS, RTT, SBE, SLS, TTA, VAT). <sup>4,5,6</sup>	15

<sup>1</sup> Students must take MAT 150, which counts as STA 250 at John Jay and counts towards the 15 credits needed to satisfy the major's *Part One Required Courses Disciplinary Requirements*.

<sup>2</sup> Students must take Introduction to Sociology – SOC 100 (SOC 101) to fulfill the Individual & Society requirement.

<sup>3</sup> Students must take PSY 100 in order to take upper level PSY courses later in the curriculum at BMCC.

4 Students must take PSY 260, which counts as PSY 242 at John Jay and satisfies the major's *Part Two Multi-Disciplinary Foundations* requirement.

5 Students must take CRJ 102, which counts as SOC 203 at John Jay and counts towards the 15 credits needed to satisfy the major's *Part One Required Courses Disciplinary Requirements*.

6 Students must take SOC 240 & SOC 250, which count as SOC 201 and SOC 202 respectively, at John Jay and satisfy the major's *Part Five B Sociology Electives* requirements.

## **F. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES**

1. *Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:*  
When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by each institution.
2. *Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:*  
Each semester John Jay will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
3. *Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:*  
This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website and on John Jay's website. Transfer advisers at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
