- The Division of Applied Undergraduate Studies accepts transfer credits only. Course grades will not be transferred.
- Regarding official transcripts from any other college or university attended prior to Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC), credits will be evaluated under the standard NYU School of Professional Studies transfer credit policies.
- Students who wish to transfer but do not meet all the above requirements or are unable to enroll within two years after graduation will receive admission consideration under the standard NYU School of Professional Studies transfer credit policies.

F. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

- 1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

 When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by representatives from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program directors.
- 2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

 Each semester NYU School of Professional Studies will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
- Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:
 This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website, and on the NYU School of Professional Studies website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

G. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION (E.G., FINANCIAL AID, TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS)

The NYU School of Professional Studies Division of Applied Undergraduate Studies has partnered with the NYU Steinhardt School of Culture, Education, and Human Development in the Community College Transfer Opportunity Program (CCTOP).
