COMPREHENSIVE "2+2" TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

I. PURPOSE

Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) of The City University of New York, a community college located in New York, NY and **Mercy College**, an institution in Westchester County, NY, agree to articulate the degree programs outlined in this document to ensure a smooth transfer process for **BMCC** graduates.

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement (the "Agreement") is to establish collaboration between **BMCC** and **Mercy College**, to promote degree completion and facilitate the transfer process. This Agreement provides assurance that students will matriculate into **Mercy College** with junior standing. The following general principles guide the operation of this Agreement:

II. ADMISSIONS

This agreement applies to those students who have followed the **BMCC** fall 2017 undergraduate catalog requirements, or thereafter.

This agreement only applies to students who have successfully met graduation requirements prior to enrollment at the **Mercy College**. Students are eligible for acceptance to **Mercy College** based on the following conditions:

Upon meeting transfer admission requirements students will transfer with **junior standing** at Mercy College. Students who transfer from **BMCC** to **Mercy College** are expected to adhere to general academic policies and procedures required for admission to Mercy College, and to fulfill any particular requirements (regarding GPA, prerequisites, clinical experience, etc.) that may be in place for certain academic programs at the College. For example, transfer students must satisfy grade requirements for major courses that must be at least a **C** or better to transfer, along with other grade requirements that may exist for specific programs. See the **Mercy College** catalog that specifies, in detail, all relevant academic policies and procedures.

III. ACCEPTANCE OF CREDITS

A minimum of **60** credits from the associate degrees will be applied toward the completion of the articulated bachelor's degree program. **(120 credits)**

A maximum of **75** credits can be applied toward the completion of the articulated bachelor's degree program from a 2-year school.

If all credits do not count for requirements in the major, they will then count as elective credit toward the degree.

Students will receive a transfer credit evaluation at the time of admission.

IV. REMAINING CREDITS AT RECEIVING INSTITUTION

Students who attend **Mercy College** under this agreement will be required to fulfill **Mercy College's** bachelor's degree requirements that are in effect the semester/year they matriculate. The current requirements are listed in Appendix A. and Appendix B.

V. GENERAL EDUCATION CREDITS

By virtue of completion of the A.A/ A.S. or A.A.S. degrees specified in Appendix A. and Appendix B. at **BMCC**, students with at least 48 liberal arts credits will have the lower level general education/core requirements substituted at **Mercy College** with the exception of prerequisites that have not been fulfilled.

Please note

- *Students must take the required Common Core courses and Flexible Common Core courses listed in Appendix B. in order for Mercy College to substitute the liberal arts courses for the requirements.
- * All students must take the junior seminar course at Mercy College
- *The Arts Requirement must be a theory based arts course, art/music history or appreciation.
- * Statistics does not fulfill the general education Math Requirement at Mercy College

VI. SCHOLARSHIPS

Mercy College offers several general merit scholarships to transfer students. These scholarships are offered in an effort to encourage community college students to earn their associate degree credentials, facilitate transfer to the four-year institution, and support completion of the bachelor's degree at **Mercy College**. These scholarships will also serve as marketing/recruitment tools for **Mercy College**.

The Mercy College Transfer Scholarships have the following criteria:

- Students must register at Mercy College as full-time, matriculated students
- The scholarships will be renewable as long students meet the following minimum requirements:
 - Maintain full-time matriculated status
 - Maintain satisfactory academic progress towards a degree at Mercy College.

Additional scholarships for PTK/ ABG Students

In addition, any member of **Alpha Beta Gamma**, or **Phi Theta Kappa** at **Borough of Manhattan Community College** will receive an additional one-time \$1500 scholarship. Certificate of membership required.

VII. PROMOTION/OUTREACH

BMCC and **Mercy College** agree to publicize this Agreement via, but not limited to printed and electronic marketing materials and communications. **BMCC** and **Mercy College** agree to collaborate to ensure successful transfer initiatives, including information sessions, academic presentations and direct mail/email campaigns to students with **40+** credits at **BMCC**.

XI. TERM/MONITOR/REVIEW

- **A.** The initial term of this Agreement shall be four years from the date of the last signature.
- **B.** The Agreement may be amended or renewed by mutual agreement and will be formalized via revision of this agreement.
- C. Mercy College will provide BMCC annually with statistics regarding transfer students from BMCC. Data requested includes: number of applications, enrollments, transfer credits, majors, GPAs, financial aid awarded outside of state/federal aid, as well as completion statistics.
- **D. Mercy College** and **BMCC** agree to communicate program changes in a timely manner to avoid disruption of student progress toward degree completion.

X. TERMINATION

The Agreement may be terminated by either party for just cause and after written notification with a minimum of 90 days' notice. Termination of the Agreement will not affect any students currently enrolled at or accepted to **Mercy College** at the time of termination.
