**B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM**

Borough of Manhattan Community College graduates are required to meet the minimum criteria for admission to Adelphi University. At this time, the University requires a grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 based upon a maximum GPA of 4.0 for admission to the College of Nursing and Public Health. In addition, Borough of Manhattan Community College graduates are required to be licensed as a registered nurse in the State of New York or the eligibility for licensure endorsement is required.

Applicants whose GPA falls below a 3.0 will be given individual consideration on a case-by-case basis.

**C. TRANSFER OF CREDITS AND COURSE EQUIVALENCY**

Borough of Manhattan Community College students will be eligible to receive up to a maximum of 64 transfer credits at Adelphi University. Only courses completed with a grade of “C-” or higher will be accepted in transfer to the University.

Students who complete the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing at Borough of Manhattan Community College will be responsible for Adelphi University’s General Education requirements either with appropriate transfer credits from Borough of Manhattan Community College and/or courses taken at Adelphi University. Courses not outlined in the attached Transfer Course Equivalency Table will be evaluated on an individual bases. ## **D. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES**

### **1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:**

This agreement becomes effective on the date of signature by representatives of the institutions reflected below and shall be effective for a period of one (1) year from the effective date. Thereafter this agreement will automatically renew for periods of one (1) year each until the anniversary of the effective date or until terminated by one or both parties upon thirty days' prior written notice to each other. Notwithstanding this, the terms of this agreement may be modified or terminated at any time upon the mutual consent of both institutions with appropriate notification. In the event it is decided at any time to modify or terminate this agreement, commitments made to individual students already in the program will continue in effect in the terms applicable at the time the student enrolled in the program.

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their Chairpersons.

### **2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:**

Each semester, Adelphi University will provide the Borough of Manhattan Community College the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) and the number of BMCC students who enrolled; d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

### **3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:**

This articulation agreement will be publicizing on the Borough of Manhattan Community College's website, and Adelphi University's website.

Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

## **E. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION (e.g., financial aid, transfer scholarships)**

Academic scholarships range from \$1,500 to \$10,000 plus, based on cumulative G.P.A. and full-time study (part-time scholarships are also available). The minimum cumulative G.P.A. required for an academic scholarship is a 3.0. Need-based financial aid is also available to those who qualify. Priority filing date for Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is February 15 for fall applicants and October 15 for spring applicants.

## **F. ADVISOR RECOMMENDATIONS**

Borough of Manhattan Community College students who plan to transfer into the RN to BSN degree program at Adelphi University are advised to choose the Program Requirements and Program

Electives listed above in order to satisfy the requirements for the A.A.S. degree in Nursing at BMCC and to ensure that the maximum number of credits are transferred to satisfy the Nursing major requirements at Adelphi University.

## G. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

1. **Entire Agreement:** This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous agreements, discussions, or representations with respect to the subject matter thereof.
2. **Independent Contractors:** The relationship established under this Agreement shall be that of independent contractors and neither party shall be, nor hold itself out to the public as being, an employee, agent, joint venturer or partner of the other. Neither party shall have authority to contract for or bind the other in any manner. There is no intended or actual third party beneficiary of this Agreement.
3. **Assignment:** Neither party may assign or transfer its rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Failure of a party to enforce any provision of this Agreement will not be a waiver of such provision nor of the right to enforce such provision.
4. **Severability:** If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the validity and enforceability of the remaining provisions will not be affected thereby.
5. **Arbitration:** In the event of any dispute between the parties regarding the terms of this Agreement or the obligations of any party hereunder, all such disputes shall be referred to binding arbitration by a single arbitrator in New York under the arbitration rules of the American Arbitration Association.
6. **Choice of Law and Venue:** This Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of New York, without regard to its conflict of laws provisions. Any action brought pursuant to or in connection with this Agreement shall be brought only in the state or federal courts within the State of New York.
7. Each party signing this Agreement represents that it has been signed by an individual who is authorized by his or her entity to enter into this Agreement on behalf of such entity.
8. **Notice:** Notices under this Agreement shall be deemed given (a) on the following business day when sent by overnight courier; or (b) three (3) days following registered mailing, in each case to the other party at the address specified below or such new address as a party shall communicate to the other in writing from time to time.

each party as well as legal fees to be paid by either party to counsel for any person or party), and from and against any and all suits, claims and demands of every kind and nature, by or on behalf of any person, the estate or heirs of any person, firm, association or corporation including punitive damages, arising out of or based upon any accident, injury to person or damage to property however occurring regardless of whether same is due to the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of a party, and/or a party's trustees, officers, directors, employees, and agents. Such liability shall not be limited to any insurance coverage herein provided or required.

10. **Compliance with Law** All services to be performed under this agreement shall conform to all applicable federal, state and local laws including, but not limited to, laws relating to equal employment opportunity.
