B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

- Students must maintain a 2.5 cumulative grade point average (GPA) on a 4-point scale to be reviewed for admission.
- Students will be granted, upon acceptance into the BS in Nursing at New York City College of Technology, a total of 65 transfer credits for the BMCC A.A.S. Nursing Degree:
 - 42 credits will be granted from the BMCC Associate-Level Program Specific Nursing Courses and
 - o 23 credits from the BMCC General Education Common Core
- Additional courses at BMCC deemed equivalent toward the B.S. in Nursing at NYCCT will be transferrable, up to 21 additional credits (13 credits in nursing courses), provided the student receives a minimum grade of "C" in the course.
- A 34-credit residency is required for the B.S. in Nursing at NYCCT.
- Applicants must hold a current license in New York State as a Registered Professional Nurse prior to registration in a nursing course with a clinical component at NYCCT.

NOTE: Students must complete all BS in Nursing Degree requirements for graduation at NYCCT including maintaining a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average in the required 120 credits necessary for graduation from the nursing program.

Additional courses completed at BMCC deemed equivalent to courses at NYCCT will be transferrable provided the student receives a minimum grade of "C" and students will satisfy NYCCT residency requirement.

E. PROCEDURES FOR REVIEWING, UP-DATING, MODIFYING OR TERMINATING THIS AGREEMENT:

- This agreement will be reviewed every two years. When either of the degree programs involved in this undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by representatives from each institution.
- Should the agreement be modified or terminated, NYCCT, School of Professional Studies shall honor the terms granted to students who have already been accepted into and or transferred into the B.S. in Nursing program for a period of four years or graduation, whichever comes first.
- The NYCCT, School of Professional Studies Registrar and the Nursing Program Chair shall produce reports of the metrics identified above and circulate to the following groups at both institutions:
 - o Chief Academic Officer, Associate Provost, Chair of Nursing Department, Director of Student Services, Director of Career Services, Director of Admission and Director of Advisement.
 - The NYCCT, School of Professional Studies and BMCC will publicize this opportunity for students. Additionally both institutions will provide information to their own recruitment staff members. NYCCT will attend recruiting events on-campus at BMCC regularly.
