Students must take MAT 150 to get transfer credit for STA 250 that satisfies John Jay's major requirements Part Two: Research Methods. Students receive only the 3.0 credits attached to John Jay College of Criminal Justice's course; the remaining credit may transfer as elective.

Students must take either SOC 200 or SOC 250, which transfer as SOC 302 and SOC 202, respectively, to satisfy John Jay's major requirements Part Four: Sociology Elective.

Students must take SOC 240 in order to get transfer credit for SOC 201, which satisfies John Jay's major requirements Part Three: Specialization. Students can choose to specialize in either Global Change or Inequality & Social Justice.

- 1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:
 When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by each institution.
- Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:
 Each semester John Jay will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
- 3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

 This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website and on John Jay's

website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
