Resolution on Academic Freedom policy committee

RESOLVED, that Article I, Part A, Section 5 subsection c be amended to provided for a standing committee on Academic Freedom and adding subsection e, vii, which sets forth the functions of the Academic Freedom Committee

Article I, Part A, Section 5, subsection c

c. The standing policy committees are:

Academic Standing Admissions Curriculum Faculty Development Student Affairs Instruction Academic Freedom

Article I, Part A, Section 5 subsection e

vii. The Academic Freedom Committee educates the faculty on academic freedom issues and concerns, conducts screening and oversight of academic freedom complaints referred to the committee by faculty, and maintains a record of academic freedom violations reviewed by the committee. The America Association of University Professors' definition of academic freedom will guide the committee.
