Resolution to Condemn Police Murder of Young African-American and Latino Males and to condemn the tragic murders of Trayvon Martin and Ramarley Graham on February 2

WHEREAS at any given time the African-American and Latino communities are consistently harassed, defamed and profiled by local law enforcements; and

WHEREAS the stop-and-frisk actions reached an all-time national highin 2011, especially in the city of New York where a record-breaking 690,000 stop-and-frisks occurred—87% of them targeted at African American and Latino males; and

WHEREAS we have a grave concern about the racist profiling of African-American males, more particularly in New York City; and

WHEREAS the tragic loss of Ramarley Graham who was shot and killed by the NYPD without any reason to fire nor any warrant to invade the home in which he lived; and

WHEREAS the tragic and unfortunate loss of Trayvon Martin, who was murdered by Florida neighborhood watch captain George Zimmerman who claimed the right to shoot in self-defense, even though Trayvon Martin was unarmed; and

WHEREAS George Zimmerman who moments before the shooting called Trayvon Martin a "coon"; and

WHEREAS the Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) is the largest college in the City University of New York (CUNY) and where its students express consistent fear about their own safety in the event that they are stopped by the New York City Police Department; and

WHEREAS BMCC has the largest African-American male student population in the CUNY system; therefore

Let it be RESOLVED that BMCC Student Government Association (SGA) who represent the 23,862 students who attend the college forcefully condemns these malignant acts of racist profiling and brutality against African-American and Latino males; and

Be it RESOLVED that the members of the SGA forcefully condemn the tragic loss of Ramarley Graham who was murdered by the NYPD on February 2, 2012; and

Be it RESOLVED that the members of SGA forcefully condemn the tragic loss of Travyon Martin who was murdered by George Zimmerman; and

BE it RESOLVED that the members of SGA and the students of BMCC are in full support of the families of Ramarley Graham and Trayvon Martin in ensuring that justice is served and their deaths be not in vain; and
